

## 4TU Cyber Energy week pitch

In the week of 3-7 September 2018, about 30 Master students cyber security from TU Delft and U Twente will working at an off-site (in Amsterdam) on real business cases in cyber security and energy.

We ask you to provide the cases and to teach our students what matters for the business. A typical involvement of a company would be a half day workshop at the off-site with one or two colleagues to present a case, and to help the with their students work, and to give the students feedback.

For example, you could ask the students to manage a (simulated) crisis. This requires regular injects of new information, which the students must act upon. Another task could be to prepare and deliver a briefing on a new wave of ransom-ware attacks to C-level executives. The list of possibilities is endless.

We hope that by working with you, students will understand that the business determines how the cyber security of a company is run. The students appreciate it if they can do some technical work as part of the assignment but the emphasis should be on the business.

We have organised similar weeks before but with different sectors. The feedback from the companies and organisations involved has always been positive. Being able to network with young talent can be very inspiring.

Taking part in the 4TU Cyber Energy week gives you direct access to 30 talented and very well educated young people who will soon be looking for employment. **Therefore, we are confident that participating would facilitate you in recruiting.**
